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ow that 2018 is coming to a close, I tried to come up with a descriptive word or two that would sum up this year at the free clinic. After much thought, I finally looked in the thesaurus and found a few words that would work: monumental, notable, mind-blowing and my favorite, **2018 was a** "doozie"! So much has

happened and so much is about to happen! This year we've had staff additions and changes, programs and services added, and we're now re-thinking our role in this ever-changing healthcare industry.

Beginning on January 1, 2019, nearly 400,000 Virginians who are between 0-138% of the Federal Poverty Level (FPL) will be newly eligible to receive Medicaid. How wonderful that our neediest residents including uninsured, underinsured and working poor will have access to healthcare beyond the Free Clinic. While this is great news on the surface, this is in no way saying that our job at the Orange County Free Clinic is done. In reality, there are still between 90,000 and 100,000 Virginians that Medicaid will not cover. The OCFC's eligibility requirements have always been to help patients between 0-200% of the federal poverty level (FPL) and we will continue to provide quality healthcare to our patients that qualify for Free Clinic services. We also plan to not abandon our patients that receive Medicaid but can't find a local provider that can see them in a timely manner. Unfortunately, our community has a limited amount of medical practices, and we're concerned that these practices won't be able to accommodate thousands of new patients come January 2019. It's a bit of a dilemma, but our mission will remain the same, "dedicated to the belief that everyone should have access to health care services". So, we're not going anywhere, anytime soon!

In closing, I'd like to say thank you to Everyone who has had involvement in the success of Orange County Free Clinic, be it those on the Board, working here, volunteering, donating financially and/or in-kind, or supporting us with words or thoughts. We all make a difference.

Please continue to include us in your annual year-end giving and know that your gifts are truly "Gifts of Life".

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Worth knowing...

- OCFC served over 900 patients from July 1, 2017 through June 30, 2018 with 4,300 visits;
- **OCFC** is one of 63 Free and Charitable Clinics in Virginia and a network of over 1300 in the Country.
- Chronic Care patients make up about 70% of patients at the OCFC. Chronic illnesses, such as Diabetes, Hypertension, High Cholesterol, Obesity and Depression, when left unchecked, can lead to life threatening issues.
- The Medication Assistance Program (MAP) paves the way for qualified residents to receive generic and brand name medications, usually for free. The Clinic pays between \$6-\$7K plus for generic prescriptions each month for acute and chronic care. Costly brand name prescriptions are managed and coordinated for patients who receive free medicines valued at just under \$1 million per month through the MAP!
- OCFC began providing Women's Health and Wellness Services in memory of Carole Roddy, one of the Clinic's founders and well loved supporter of the Clinic! The UVA Mobile Mammography comes to the Clinic once every month offering free screenings.
- Mental Health Services are offered by a licensed Counselor two days per week.


Volunteer Spotlight Sue Sulzer


Team Work Makes the Dream Work...

ATHENA, EHR

Preparing for what's ahead...our new Electronic Health Records System (EHR) puts us in a far better place as we aim to accommodate the changes and growth in health care needs!

Up and running since October 1, there are still over 1,000 records that have to be entered and scanned into the cloud based system, but what's a few hundred additional hours for the brave and the few! The launch, coordinated by Lisa Wilson (below), **OCFC Office Manager**, is progressing quickly. The \$50,000 plus system was donated by Athena Health Systems to free clinics across the state and will give us the capability to easily coordinate care with every level of healthcare providers (Physician offices, Hospitals, Labs etc.). Staff and Providers receive on-going training just in time for the new Medicaid Expansion. The Clinic will also serve as an enrollment site for newly eligible residents to sign up for coverage in partnership with our local DSS.

Thanks to a grant from The Perry Foundation, we will upgrade our technology and reconfigure the front office for a more efficient workflow for patients and staff!
